The Debate on “Artificial Intelligence: Threat to Workforce and Creativity” provided a unique opportunity for students to engage in a thought-provoking discussion on the impact of Artificial Intelligence on society. By participating in the debate, students developed essential skills such as critical thinking, public speaking, and teamwork. The debate also encouraged students to think creatively and consider multiple perspectives on the topic, fostering a deeper understanding of the complex issues surrounding AI. The competition was judged by Mr. Rohit Sinha.



The topic of Artificial Intelligence being a threat to the workforce sparked a lively discussion among the debaters. Some argued that the increasing automation of jobs would lead to significant job losses, particularly in sectors where tasks are repetitive or can be easily automated. Others countered that while AI might replace some jobs, it would also create new opportunities in fields such as AI development and maintenance. The discussion also touched on the potential benefits of AI in augmenting human capabilities and improving productivity.

The aspect of AI being a threat to Creativity was another contentious issue. Some debaters argued that AI- generated art, music and literature would lead to a homogenization of creative output, stifling human imagination and originality. Others saw AI as a tool that could assist and inspire human creatives, enabling them to explore new ideas and push the boundaries of innovation.



To balance spontaneity with fairness, participants were given a maximum of sixty seconds to prepare their thoughts. This short period encouraged them to swiftly organize their ideas, create a structure for their speech, and gather relevant information. The speaking time typically ranged to ninety seconds. This time constraint compelled participants to convey their thoughts concisely and effectively within the stipulated duration. The core of any competition lies in the evaluation process. Students were judged on the following criteria: Command over Subject; Explanatory Skills; Level of Confidence and Starting and Ending of the Speech.



The participants impressed everyone with their conversation and demonstration competencies. The competition was highly regarded for its ability to heighten social awareness among participants. Engaging with social issues required them to delve into problems that often went unnoticed, and to understand the complexity of these issues. The students were proficient in their speech and propositions. Anishka, a first year B.Com student emerged as the winner of the debate.



The Debate on “AI: Threat to Workforce and Creativity” was a valuable experience for students providing a platform them to engage in a meaning discussion ona pressing issue. The event demonstrate the critical thinking, Creativity and effective communication in navigating the complexities of AI’s impact on society.
