# Our Inspiration

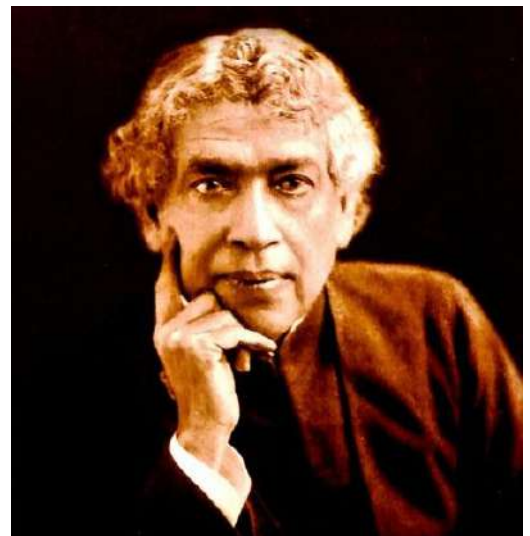
## Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose

(30 November 1858 – 23 November 1937)

Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose was a pioneering Indian scientist and polymath whose contributions spanned physics, botany, biology, biophysics and radio science. He played a key role in establishing experimental science in India and remains one of the most influential scientific figures of the modern era. A crater on the Moon is named in his honour.

He was the first to demonstrate that plants respond to external stimuli such as pain and affection. His invention of the *Crescograph*, an instrument capable of measuring minute plant growth, opened new directions in plant physiology. Bose also developed early wireless detection devices, including a galena-based photo-conducting receiver—well ahead of their global recognition.

In recognition of his groundbreaking work, he was appointed Companion of the Order of the Indian Empire in 1903 and Companion of the Order of the Star of India in 1912. The IEEE (USA) acknowledges him as a pioneer of radio science and a visionary whose work contributed significantly to modern communication technologies.

# About the University



J. C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad (formerly YMCA University of Science and Technology) was established in 2009 under Haryana State Legislative Act No. 21 of 2009 and notified vide Haryana Government Gazette Notification No. 29 of 2009 dated 16 September 2009.

The University traces its origin to 1969, when it began as the YMCA Institute of Engineering with an initial intake of 120 students. Conceived as an Indo–German project, it was a joint venture of the State Government and the National Council of YMCAs of India, with active academic and technical assistance from agencies of West Germany. The Institute was founded with the objective of imparting practice-oriented technical education on the German model to meet the specialised manpower requirements of a developing nation.

During its formative years, 20 acres of land were allotted by the State Government for academic buildings, hostels, and a residential campus. Laboratories and workshops were established with German expertise, and from 1994 onwards the Institute received 100% grant-in-aid from the State Government. The management and resources were taken over by the Government in 1998, culminating in the upgradation of YMCAIE to a State University in 2009. The University was granted UGC 12(B) status in 2012, enabling it to receive central assistance, and was accredited with an ‘A+’ Grade by NAAC in its second cycle of accreditation in 2022.

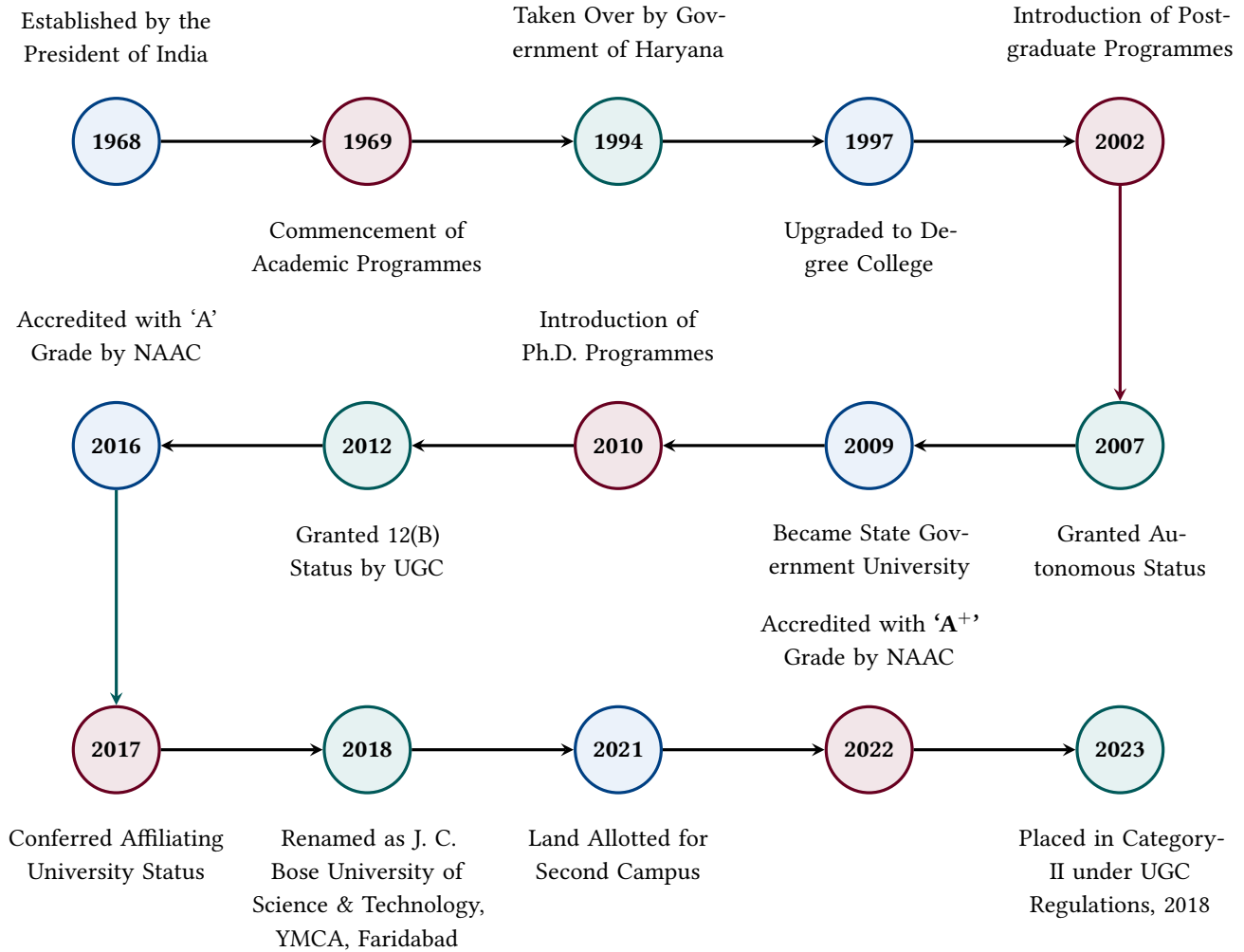
In recognition of the enduring legacy of Indian science, the University was renamed *J. C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad* in 2018 through Haryana Legislative Act No. 29 of 2018.

In order to grant autonomy to better-performing institutions, the University Grants Commission (UGC), in the year 2023, has grade the University under Category–II as per the provisions of the UGC [Categorization of Universities (Only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018.

The University continues to retain the salient strengths of the German education system, particularly its emphasis on hands-on training and practical competence. State-of-the-art laboratories and workshops enable students to acquire strong technical skills and independent problem-solving abilities.



Located on National Highway-2 (Mathura Road), approximately 30 km from the National Capital, the University campus lies within the Faridabad-Ballabgarh industrial corridor. In addition, the State Government has allotted 18 acres of land at village Bhakari on Faridabad-Gurugram Road for the development of a second campus.

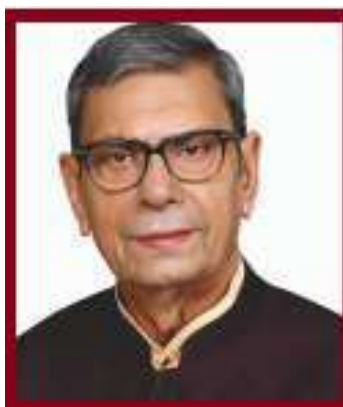

**Undergraduate Certificate:** Students who opt to exit after the successful completion of the first year of the undergraduate programme and earn the requisite credits, including an additional 4-credit vocational course, shall be awarded an **Undergraduate Certificate** (Level 4.5).

**Undergraduate Diploma:** Students who opt to exit after the successful completion of the second year of the undergraduate programme and earn the requisite credits, including an additional 4-credit vocational course, shall be awarded an **Undergraduate Diploma** (Level 5).

**Bachelor's Degree:** Students who successfully complete three years of the undergraduate programme and earn the requisite credits shall be awarded a **Bachelor's Degree** in the major discipline (Level 5.5). In the case of **B. Tech.** programmes, students who opt to exit after the successful completion of the third year and earn the requisite credits, including an additional 4-credit vocational course, shall be awarded a **Bachelor of Vocation** in the major discipline (Level 5.5).

**Bachelor's Degree with Honours:** Students who successfully complete the four-year undergraduate degree programme and earn the requisite credits shall be awarded a **Bachelor's Degree with Honours** (in the case of B. Tech. programmes 'Bachelor of Technology' shall be awarded) in the major discipline (Level 6). This provision is **not applicable to B. Voc. programmes**

**Bachelor's Degree with Honours with Research:** Students who secure **75% or above marks** in the first six semesters and opt for the research track in the fourth year shall be awarded a **Bachelor's Degree with Honours with Research** in the major discipline (Level 6). This provision is **not applicable to B. Tech. and B. Voc. programmes.**

- Students opting for an early exit, as per the provisions stated above, may be allowed to re-enter the same degree programme within three years, subject to University rules, and complete the programme within the maximum permissible duration of seven years.

*The above provisions are subject to UGC regulations, statutory approvals, and University rules in force from time to time.*

Candidates are advised to carefully check their eligibility criteria before applying for the programme(s) of their choice. Merit shall be prepared programme-wise based on the information furnished by the candidates in their application forms; however, eligibility and other relevant details shall be verified by the University at the time of admission counselling/reporting.

Additional 5 marks weightage will be awarded to NSS Merit Certificate holders of 10+2 during admission to UG programs (Refer Annexure XIX).

# Multiple Entry, Lateral Entry and Credit Transfer Policy

In alignment with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) under the National Credit Framework (NCrF) and Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF), the University offers flexible entry options for students through Multiple Entry, Lateral Entry, and Credit Transfer in various Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) programmes. This policy is designed to promote academic flexibility, mobility, and student-centric learning, enabling learners to continue their education seamlessly across institutions. Key Features of the Policy are:

- **Multiple Entry Options:** Students may be admitted at different stages of a programme (not only in the first year), subject to eligibility and availability of seats.
- **Lateral Entry:** Direct admission to the second year (3rd semester) or higher may be permitted based on prior qualifications and credit equivalence.
- **Credit Transfer Facility:** Credits earned from recognized Universities/Institutions may be transferred and counted towards the degree, as per UGC norms.
- **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC):** All credits are processed through the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system, ensuring transparency and authenticity.

## Eligibility and Conditions

- Entry is generally allowed in odd semesters (at the beginning of the academic session).
- Candidates must fulfill the prescribed eligibility criteria and credit equivalence requirements as per UGC norms.
- Admission under Multiple Entry, Lateral Entry, and Credit Transfer shall be subject to the availability of vacant seats, and merit-based selection shall be followed.
- Change of discipline is permitted only at the second-year level (3rd semester) in UG programmes.
- Students may be required to complete deficient courses/credits through regular coursework, MOOCs/SWAYAM courses, or approved self-study modes, as prescribed by the concerned Department.
- Admission under these provisions shall be governed by UGC Regulations, University norms, and availability of resources.
- The decision of the University shall be final in all matters relating to admission, credit transfer, and equivalence.

## Application Process

The University shall issue separate notifications in this regard through the concerned Department/College on the University website. Applications shall be invited in online/offline mode by the concerned Departments/Colleges, and admissions shall be granted strictly on a merit basis, subject to fulfillment of eligibility and other prescribed criteria.

Candidates seeking admission under this policy are advised to consult the concerned Department/College for detailed information.

- The admission fee, including the First Semester fee, shall be deposited by all candidates at the time of reporting/admission to the University through approved modes of payment, such as **Demand Draft in favour of “Registrar, J.C. Bose UST, Faridabad”** or through **online payment via the designated payment portal(s)**, as per the prescribed fee structure for the respective programme. Cash payment shall not be accepted under any circumstances.
- Hostel and Mess charges, wherever applicable, are not included in the above fee structure and shall be payable separately by hostellers.
- In the event of withdrawal of admission by a student, the refund of fees shall be governed by the norms and guidelines issued by HSTES/UGC/AICTE/University from time to time.
- Applications for admission withdrawal/fee refund in the prescribed format (Annexure-XXIV), as provided in the Information Brochure 2026–27, must be submitted physically to the Academic Branch of the University.
- The security amount deposited by the student shall be refundable after completion of the programme or discontinuation thereof, subject to submission of a ‘**No Dues Certificate**’ from all concerned authorities within a **period of three years** from the date of leaving the course or declaration of result, failing which the security amount shall stand forfeited.
- As per University rules, a tuition fee waiver of up to 50% may be granted in University programmes to regular employees of the University and their wards.





# Criteria for Continuation of Academic Programmes

## Minimum Admission Requirement and Zero Session Policy

1. For programmes having a sanctioned intake of 30 or more seats, a minimum of 10 admissions shall be required for continuation of the programme.
2. For programmes having a sanctioned intake of less than 30 seats, a minimum of 05 admissions shall be required for continuation of the programme.

In case the number of admissions in any programme falls below the prescribed minimum limit, the programme may be declared as a “Zero Session” for that academic session and Students admitted to such programmes shall be given the option to withdraw their admission and obtain a full refund of the fee deposited, as per University norms or be considered for admission to another eligible programme, subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria, merit position, and availability of vacant seats.

Admissions in programmes falling below the prescribed minimum threshold shall not be continued for that academic session.

## Provision for Alternate Programme Allocation

Applicants/Students admitted in programmes with admissions below the prescribed minimum requirement may be considered for admission to other programmes offered by the University, subject to fulfilment of the eligibility criteria prescribed for the concerned programme, position in the merit list; and availability of vacant seats in the respective programme.



# Minor Degree Programs

Minor Degree / Specialization programs have been introduced with the objective of enhancing employability skills and providing focused knowledge in emerging areas that are not typically covered under the regular Undergraduate Degree curriculum. Each Minor Degree consists of **18–20 credits**, offered in addition to the **160 credits** (generally) required for the Major Degree.

With support from industry–academia experts and keeping in mind the rapidly evolving skill requirements in modern sectors, the University has carefully designed curricula for various Minor Degree Programs. # Important Instructions to Applicants

Candidates are advised to carefully read and follow the instructions/information given below before applying for admission to various programs offered by the University through its University Teaching Departments (UTDs).

## General Instructions

1. Candidates can apply for admission to programs offered by the University through the University Teaching Departments (UTDs) in online mode only, as per the schedule notified in the University Admission Notice published in national newspapers and on the University website. Applications submitted in physical form shall not be accepted unless notified otherwise.
2. For B.Tech. and B.Tech. (LEET), candidates must follow the admission schedule notified by the Haryana State Technical Education Society (HSTES), Panchkula.
3. Candidates must check the intake, eligibility, mode of admission, and fee structure for the program(s) they wish to apply for.
4. An application is considered complete only after successful fee payment through the payment gateway. Incomplete or unpaid applications will be automatically cancelled.
5. Application fees are non-refundable under any circumstances.
6. Candidates are strongly advised to apply early to avoid last-minute issues.
7. Candidates must retain the printout of the online admission form for future reference.
8. Registration must be done using a valid email ID and mobile number which shall remain active throughout the admission process.
9. The Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) ID is mandatory for Haryana residents. Only verified PPP data will be considered for reservation/benefits.
10. Candidates must correctly select applicable categories. A candidate will not be considered for a category not selected during application.
11. Candidates may apply for multiple categories (AIC/HOGC/SC/ST/BC/PH/FF/ESM/TFW/EWS/KM/HGST/SGC) through a single application, if eligible.
12. Haryana residents should select HOGC/Reserved Categories accordingly. Selecting AIC excludes them from HOGC/reserved category benefits.
13. Haryana Open General Category (HOGC) candidates must fulfill any of the following:
  - a. Candidates with verified PPP ID.
  - b. Certificate of Employer for employees of Government of Haryana/All India Services on Haryana Cadre.
14. Candidates belonging to SC, SCD, BC-A/BC-B must submit certificates issued by competent authorities. BC certificates must confirm “non-creamy layer” compliance as per notification dated 16.07.2024.
15. For EWS category, candidates must upload a current-year EWS certificate issued only by Haryana authorities and a domicile certificate if last qualification was from outside Haryana.
16. For Tuition Fee Waiver (TFW), annual family income must be below ₹8 lakh and verified through PPP. A valid Haryana domicile is required if qualifying exam passed outside Haryana.



17. Kashmiri Migrant (KM) candidates must submit a certificate issued by the Relief Commissioner.
18. PH/ESM/FF category candidates must possess valid certificates as per latest HSTES norms.
19. HGST candidates must submit certificates as per Annexure-X of the HSTES Brochure.
20. Aadhaar linkage with bank account is mandatory for admission (as per Higher Education Department instructions).
21. Eligibility will be verified at the time of counseling/admission/reporting.
22. Candidates must bring original documents with two sets of self-attested copies for verification. Originals shall not be retained.
23. Candidates awaiting results may apply but must submit final result within notified dates, failing which admission will be cancelled and fee forfeited.
24. Admissions shall be made strictly within sanctioned intake and State Reservation Policy.
25. No request for change in category after publication of merit list shall be entertained.
26. All admission-related information shall be displayed on the University website only.
27. False information or suppression of facts will lead to cancellation of admission and legal action.
28. All admitted candidates shall be governed by University Regulations/Ordinances.
29. On-spot grievances shall be resolved by the Dean of the concerned faculty or the Admission Grievance Committee through the Academic Branch.
30. In case of any inconsistency, interpretation of the Competent Authority shall be final.

## Instructions for Filing Online Application

1. Candidates must carefully read the Information Brochure and guidelines before filling the Online Application Form.
2. Appearance in Entrance Test is provisional and does not confer any right to claim admission.
3. No column should be left blank. Write "N.A." where not applicable.
4. Candidates providing false information shall be debarred from admission.
5. If admitted on the basis of incorrect information, admission will be cancelled and fee forfeited.
6. Keep the following documents ready before filling the form:

  - c. Caste/Class/EWS Certificates (if applicable)

Admissions of candidates failing to submit requisite documents within the prescribed period shall be automatically cancelled. No further extension shall be granted.



# Distribution of Seats and Reservation

The University strictly follows the reservation policy of the State Government of Haryana, subject to any amendments issued from time to time.

## Reservation for Scheduled Castes

As per Notification No. 22/27/2019-1GS-III dated 04.06.2020 issued by Government of Haryana:

“50% of the 20% seats reserved for Scheduled Castes in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes. If a seat earmarked for Deprived SC remains unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidates, it shall be offered to SC candidates.”

Refer Annexure–XVII for the list of Scheduled Castes and Deprived Scheduled Castes.

## Reservation for Backward Classes

Candidates must submit a Backward Class certificate (BCA or BCB) as per Annexure-V and a creamy layer/annual parental income certificate as per No. 491-SW(1)-2021 dated 17 November 2021. Refer to Annexure-VII for the notification.



## Reservation for Ex-Servicemen and Wards of Freedom Fighters

If the quota reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates remains unutilized due to non-availability of suitable candidates, it may be offered to Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%). Additionally, a 3% horizontal reservation is provided within the General Category (1%), Scheduled Castes (1%), and Backward Classes (1%) for admission to government and government-aided institutes in Haryana. For Backward Classes, a year-wise rotational system is adopted (e.g., Block-A in 2020, Block-B in 2021).

## Reservation for Female Candidates

A **25% horizontal reservation** is provided for female candidates across all categories.

## Economically Weaker Section (EWS)

Persons belonging to the Economically Weaker Section (EWS), not covered under existing reservations for Scheduled Castes or Backward Classes, receive a 10% supernumerary reservation in admissions. Candidates must apply separately for the EWS scheme and submit a certificate as per Annexure-XIII, issued per Instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.

## Supernumerary Seat for Single Girl Child

One supernumerary seat is created in UGC-approved courses (except AICTE-approved programs like B.Tech, BBA, BCA, M.Tech, MBA, MCA) for a single girl child of her parents. Admission is based on the entrance test or qualifying examination marks, as per the University Information Brochure. An affidavit on a ₹20/- stamp paper, attested by a 1st Class Magistrate, must confirm the girl is the only child (no siblings). If vacant, this seat is not offered to other categories. Eligible candidates from Haryana are prioritized, with admission based on merit if multiple claimants exist.

## Tuition Fee Waiver (TFW) Scheme

The Tuition Fee Waiver (TFW) Scheme applies to B.Tech, BBA, BCA, MCA, and MBA programs as per AICTE guidelines, with up to 5% of approved intake available. Eligible candidates have parents with an annual income not exceeding ₹8,00,000/-. All fees except tuition are payable. Beneficiaries cannot change their institution or program. Unfilled TFW seats are not transferred to other categories.

## Haryana Government School Topper (HGST) Scheme

One seat per branch/discipline in B.Tech programs is reserved for toppers of 10+2 (Science stream, current academic year, minimum 2nd Division) within the sanctioned intake.

## Support for Abandoned, Surrendered, and Orphan Children

One seat in all UG/PG programs is reserved for Abandoned, Surrendered, and Orphan Children. For AICTE-approved programs, this seat falls under the EWS category and merges with EWS if vacant. For non-AICTE programs, it's a supernumerary seat and remains vacant if unfilled. Eligibility criteria:

- (a) Abandoned and Surrendered Children up to age 25, admitted to Child Care Institutions before age 5 (Abandoned) or 1 (Surrendered), and aged over 18 while in care.

- (b) Orphan Children who have lost both parents, lack a legal guardian, or have a guardian unwilling/incapable of care, with family income below ₹2,00,000/- per annum.

Eligible candidates receive free higher education, including technical education and hostel facilities, but must meet the program's minimum eligibility criteria (see Annexure-XX).

## Important Instructions for Reserved Category Seats

- The reservation policy follows the State Government of Haryana and is subject to amendments.
- Eligible candidates from reserved categories of Haryana are considered for Haryana General Category seats first.
- Haryana Resident certificate must follow Annexure-II.
- Candidates passing their qualifying examination from a University/College/School in Haryana are deemed Haryana Residents and need not submit a Bonafide Resident certificate.
- Scheduled Caste candidates must submit a certificate as per Annexure-IV and Deprived Scheduled Caste candidates as per Annexure-XV.
- Backward Class (Block A & B) candidates must submit a certificate as per Annexure-V and an income certificate per Instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004. Both parents must provide an affidavit/undertaking confirming non-creamy layer status (Annexure-VI, VII).
- Differently-abled candidates with a permanent disability of at least 40% must submit a certificate from the Chief Medical Officer of the district's Medical Board (Annexure-VIII).
- Children/grandchildren of Freedom Fighters of Haryana must submit a certificate as per Annexure-IX.
- False claims of Haryana residency lead to removal, fee confiscation, and further action as deemed appropriate.
- Unutilized Physically Handicapped quota may be offered to Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Voc. through which the students of various streams not only get a financial support for their studies but also gain hands-on experience which would certainly stand by them in their future career as well.

## Gram Panchayat Scholarship Scheme

Under Gram Panchayat Scholarship Scheme (announced since Academic Year 2025-26), 100% tuition fee waiver is granted to a maximum of five (05) student per course for admission in each B.Voc, Diploma and PG Diploma Courses of CCSD on the recommendations of Sarpanch of the respective Gram Panchayat. Notifications are issued in the month of October annually

- Must belong to the Economically Weaker Section (EWS)
- Must possess a valid EWS certificate issued by the State Government
- Must Submit Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) for income verification
- Annual family income must be less than ₹.8,00,000/- as per State Government Instructions.

# Hostel Facility



The University provides Hostel facility for Girl students of the University campus with in the premises. **The Boys' Hostel has been demolished for reconstruction and is presently not available.** The Girls' Hostel offers a safe and disciplined residential environment for girl students for their duration of stay in the University. The Girls' Hostel comprises of five wings:

1. Kasturba Hall
2. Sarojini Hall
3. Mother Teresa Hall
4. Kalpana Chawla Hall
5. A. Lalitha Hall

Dedicated staff members are available for taking care of the hostel residents. They include a resident attendant, lady guards, sweepers and data entry operator. Strict rules have been implemented to maintain discipline and hygiene within the hostel premises, with special emphasis on prohibition of ragging. The hostel promotes congeniality and cohesiveness.

The hostel is equipped with facilities such as reading rooms, common rooms, Wi-Fi in reading and common rooms, water coolers fitted with RO, CCTV surveillance, and 24X7 security guards. Recreational facility include provisions for indoor and outdoor games along with TV, magazines and newspapers.

A visitor room is available at the entry of Girls' Hostel for the male relatives of the students. Guest rooms are provided for the stay of female relatives on per day payment basis. Hostel accommodation is allotted strictly on a first-come, first-served basis with distance from the student hometown given priority.

## Mess Facility

The hostel has two dining areas run by Mess Contractor on contract basis. Here, breakfast, lunch and dinner is served with clean utensils for proper dining. Snacks etc. may be purchased during the evening from the vendor kiosk in the mess. Police verification and medical check-ups of the mess workers are carried out to ensure student safety. Periodic inspections are carried out to maintain vigilance over food quality.

A separate kiosk is also available for purchase of different snacks and beverages throughout the day.



## Hostel and Mess Rules

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and banned as per UGC Regulations (2009). In case of disciplinary action, only parents' presence/undertaking is valid.
2. The University Girls' hostel mess is run on a contract basis and supervised by Hostel authorities with support from student representatives.
3. All the hostel residents are expected to have meals in the hostel mess.
4. Hostel Residents must carry their Hostel ID Card to the mess. Failing this, warnings and then fines will be issued.
5. Meals will be served during notified hours. In case of illness, meals may be served in the room.
6. Hostel Residents are not allowed to enter the cooking area.
7. Cooking in the hostel rooms including common room & reading room is strictly prohibited.
8. No hostel resident shall take meals from the mess to which she does not belong. A member is not permitted to take food in place of another member.
9. Facility of induction stove tops & electric kettles is available. Students can prepare their beverages & snacks at those designated places.
10. The timing of meals generally will be:

Breakfast	07:30 am to 09:30 am
Lunch	12:30 pm to 02:15 pm
Dinner	08:00 pm to 09:30 pm

Above timings are flexible with the consent of the CHW /ACHW depending upon University time table .

11. Removal of Utensils (cups, saucers, tumblers etc.) from the hostel mess is strictly prohibited.
12. Hostel Residents must maintain decorum in dining halls. They should not enter the kitchen or self-serve. Proper dress must be worn during meals.
13. Mess bills must be paid by the 12th of every month. A fine of ₹10/- per day will be charged thereafter. No rebate for defaulters.
14. The residents of the hostel can submit the hostel and one month mess charges either in form of Demand Draft to CHW office or via Online payment at the begging of session.
15. "No Dues Certificate" will be issued only after clearing all hostel dues.
16. A minimum mess bill equivalent to 25 days must be paid by every hostel resident.
17. After examination, Hostel Residents must submit a copy of the "No Dues Slip" signed by hostel attendant, along with Hostel ID, before leaving.
18. No drugs, alcohol, e-cigarettes or tobacco products are allowed on hostel premises. Strict disciplinary action will follow.
19. Misbehavior with hostel staff will be treated as misconduct. Complaints of any matter must be submitted in writing.
20. Procedure for permission for extra-curricular activities after the hostel timings:-
  - a. Submit a written request to Hostel, duly signed by Chairperson/DSW.
  - b. Warden must indicate "Recommended/Not Recommended".
  - c. ACHW (Girls) forwards the case to the Proctor/Chief Hostel Warden for security arrangements.
  - d. After the activity, Warden must ensure all hostel residents return to the hostel.



## Hostel and Mess Charges

1. Girl's Hostel will be allotted to all the University Girls subject to availability. Hostel will be allotted on first come first serve basis. Hostel charges of ₹19,300/- to be deposited in **Online** mode through UPI when student arrives to the University premises.

### Note:

1. Monthly Mess bill of ₹3400/-\* (approx.) will be charged extra on diet basis.
2. Fee refunds will be made in accordance with hostel regulations in the event of withdrawing from a hostel seat.
3. Mess Charges from July 2026 session will be Rs. 108/- per day. The amount is rounded off to ₹3400/-.
4. During the months of final end semester exams, if the student leaves before 15th of the month, she will pay the mess charges on daily basis and if the students stays for 15 days or any further then a minimum mess bill charge for 25 days or till the date in the month the mess is officially on must be paid.



# Scholarships & Merit Awards

## SC and BC Post Matric Scholarship

Under the Higher Education Department's scheme, Scheduled Caste (SC) and Backward Class (BC) students with parents'/guardians' annual income not exceeding ₹2.50 lakhs are eligible for tuition fee reimbursement and other admissible allowances, subject to 75% attendance in each semester and prevailing State Government instructions.

Applications are invited in November/December annually, online or offline, per notices on the University website or by the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Chandigarh.

## Merit-cum-Means Scholarship

15% of the sanctioned strength of B.Tech., MCA, and MBA programs are eligible for a Merit-cum-Means Scholarship of ₹750/- per month. Parental income criteria follow State Government norms. Performance and attendance requirements are per University rules or as decided by the Competent Authority.

*These scholarships apply only to candidates from Haryana or those admitted through Central Counseling.*

## Vishwa Prakash Mission Scholarships

Vishwa Prakash Mission, Faridabad, offers Merit-cum-Means scholarships since 2016-17. Notifications are issued in October-November annually.

## Bharti Airtel Foundation Scholarships

Bharti Airtel Scholarship is an initiative by Bharti Airtel Foundation (Philanthropic arm of Bharti Enterprises) designed to support meritorious students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. The scholarship aims to support deserving students get access to higher education by removing financial barriers. With a preference for girls, the scholarship covers 100% tuition fees for select courses, along with hostel and mess fees for students residing on campus. **Eligibility Criteria :**

- Parents' / guardian annual income from all sources should not exceed INR 8.5 Lakh.
- Preference will be given to girl students, person with disabilities, single parent/no parent and transgender students.
- Students should not be a recipient of any other scholarship/grants for the same purposes as being supported by Bharti Airtel Foundation.
- Continuity of scholarships will be subject to meeting the renewal criteria every year

- If a female student receives the Governor/Chancellor Gold Medal, the Chief Minister Gold Medal goes to the next female topper.
- Each student is eligible for only one prestigious award.
- Vice-Chancellor Gold Medal considers academics and co-curricular activities, with criteria set by a designated Committee.
- Awardee details are displayed securely on the University website.





# Fee Rules

## Submission of Semester Fee

- Students shall deposit the semester fee within 20 days from the commencement of each semester (Odd/Even), as per the fee schedule issued by the Accounts Branch of the University.
- Semester fee shall be paid through the University ERP Portal using the available modes such as Credit Card, Debit Card, UPI, Net Banking, etc.
- A period of 20 days from the date of issuance of notice shall be allowed for fee submission without fine, followed by an additional 15 days with a late fee fine of ₹500/-. Students seeking extension beyond this period, as a special case, shall submit a request through the concerned department stating valid reasons before the last date of fee submission with fine. An additional fine of ₹500/- shall be levied for every further block of 15 days, depending upon the duration of extension granted.
- The name of a student shall be struck off from the University rolls if the semester fee is not deposited within the notified timelines.
- A student whose name has been struck off from the University rolls may be re-admitted in the same semester of the current academic session on payment of all outstanding dues along with the applicable fine (i.e., ₹500/- for every 15 days beyond the last date of fee submission with fine) and a re-admission fee of ₹5000/-. Re-admission shall be permitted only before the commencement of examinations of the current session.
- Students whose names stand struck off from the University rolls shall not be permitted to appear in the end-semester examinations.
- Re-admission may also be permitted in the same semester of the subsequent academic session on payment of the current semester fee and the previous due semester fee, along with a lump sum fine of ₹2500/- and a re-admission fee of ₹5000/-. If the last date of fee submission falls on a holiday, the next working day shall be treated as the last date for fee submission.

## Fee received through Bank Loan or Scholarships

- To avoid hardship to students availing educational loans from banks, they shall be permitted to deposit the fee as and when the bank releases the sanctioned amount.
- Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste (SC) category and eligible for Post Matric Scholarship (PMS) shall not be required to pay any fee except refundable security money at the time of admission. An undertaking shall be obtained from such students to deposit the fee as and when the scholarship amount is credited to their bank account through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT). Eligibility shall be verified through the Scholarship Branch of the University.
- Students availing or eligible for Post Matric Scholarship shall be permitted to deposit the fee as and when the scholarship amount is released by the concerned agency.
- Students availing any loan facility for fee payment shall mandatorily obtain a demand letter from the Accounts Branch before the last date of semester fee submission, failing which the applicable fine as per University rules shall be levied.
- Students whose semester fee is received through bank loan shall update their fee status on the ERP Portal within seven (07) working days and generate the fee receipt to avoid being listed as fee defaulters. Failure to do so shall result in the matter being placed before the Standing Fee Committee for appropriate decision.
- Students are advised to regularly visit the University website and ERP Portal for updates related to fee submission. No separate communication shall be issued in this regard.

## Fee Concession and Financial Support

- A tuition fee concession of 50% shall be applicable to regular employees of the University and their wards for all programmes.
- Fee concession shall be applicable as per guidelines issued by the State Government from time to time.

## Cancellation of Admission & Refund of Fee

- The application fee deposited for online application is non-refundable.
- For all B.Tech. programmes, guidelines issued by HSTES (as per the Admission Brochure), AICTE Approval Process Handbook, and AICTE Academic Calendar of current year shall be followed. Fee refund shall be processed strictly in accordance with HSTES instructions.
- For refund of fees for all other programmes (except B.Tech.), the guidelines shall be notified separately on the University website.
- Candidates shall submit applications for withdrawal of admission and refund of fee in the prescribed format (Annexure-XXIV, as mentioned in this Information Brochure), along with requisite documents, to the Academic Branch.





# Attendance Rules

The following attendance rules and penalties for shortage of attendance shall be applicable to all students enrolled in various programmes running under the University Teaching Departments (UTDs) and the Community College of Skill Development.

- Every student must maintain a minimum of **75% aggregate attendance** at the end of each semester to be eligible to appear in the end-semester examination.
- A shortage of attendance of up to **10%** may be condoned by the concerned Chairperson/Dean in severe cases on **medical or compensatory grounds**. Accordingly, students having **65% or more attendance** may be permitted to appear in the examination, subject to approval by the competent authority.
- Students having **less than 65% attendance** shall be liable to detention.
- An additional benefit of up to **2% attendance** may be granted to students for participation in activities such as **NSS, NCC, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan**, or other approved community services during the semester, on the recommendation of the concerned In-charge/DSW.
- Students having shortage of attendance shall be debarred from appearing in the end-semester examinations as per the following criteria:
  - **Students having attendance 55% and above but less than 65%**, will be debarred from examination of one paper of that semester including all practical exams.
  - **Students having attendance 45% and above but less than 55%**, will be debarred from two papers of that semester including all practical exams.
  - **Students having attendance 35% and above but less than 45%**, will be debarred from three papers of that semester including all practical exams.
  - **Students having attendance less than 35%** will be debarred from all examination papers of that semester including all practical exams.
- The examination papers from which a student shall be debarred will be those subjects in which the student has the **lowest attendance**, or as recommended by the concerned Chairperson. Such students may appear in the debarred theory examinations in the **next academic session**, as per University rules.
- Students debarred due to shortage of attendance shall be allowed **sessional improvement** in accordance with the existing University rules.
- Students detained due to shortage of attendance shall be required to **repeat the concerned subject examination(s)** in the next academic session as **reappear examinations**.

## Monitoring of Attendance

Students are solely responsible for maintaining the requisite attendance as per University rules and for obtaining **monthly attendance updates** from their respective subject teachers. In case a student remains absent from classes continuously for **more than three days**, he/she shall inform the concerned teacher in advance.

The list of students likely to be detained due to shortage of attendance shall be published by the concerned Chairpersons well before the last teaching day of the semester, thereby providing students a final opportunity to compensate for the deficiency.

**Parents/Guardians are also advised to regularly monitor the attendance status of their son/daughter/ward by enquiring with the concerned Chairperson.**



# Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously

In accordance with the guidelines issued by the UGC and other Statutory Councils, the University permits students to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously, subject to prescribed conditions. This policy aims to provide academic flexibility while ensuring that academic standards and regulatory provisions are strictly maintained.

## General Guidelines to pursue two Academic Programmes simultaneously

1. A student of the University may pursue two full-time academic programmes within this University or in another University, provided that the class timings of one programme do not overlap with those of the other programme.
2. A student may pursue one programme in full-time physical mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or Up to two programmes in ODL/Online mode simultaneously.
3. Degree/Diploma programmes under ODL/Online mode shall be pursued only from Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) recognized by the UGC/Statutory Councils/Government of India for running such programmes.
4. All such programmes shall be governed by the Regulations notified by the UGC and the respective Statutory/Professional Councils, wherever applicable.
5. These guidelines shall apply only to students pursuing academic programmes other than Ph.D. programmes.

## Criteria for Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously

- A student of the University may pursue two academic programmes in accordance with UGC/Statutory Council guidelines.
- A student intending to pursue another academic programme in the same University or in a different University must obtain a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from this University prior to the commencement of the second programme.
- The student shall declare the preference of the academic programmes as Primary Programme and Secondary Programme at the time of applying for the NOC.
- A student of this University who wishes to pursue a secondary academic programme (within this University or in another University) shall submit a written application to the respective Chairperson of the Department for obtaining the NOC. Similarly, a student from another University seeking admission to a secondary academic programme in this University must submit an NOC/undertaking from the parent University/Institution.
- A student may pursue two academic programmes only if the class timings of the two programmes do not overlap.
- If a student is pursuing one academic programme in another Higher Education Institution and another programme in this University simultaneously, the University shall not be responsible for any clash in examination schedules or other academic activities. The student shall submit an undertaking to this effect.
- A student from another University pursuing a secondary academic programme in this University shall not be eligible for hostel facilities, scholarship, fee concession, or other similar facilities.



# Anti Ragging Guidelines and Preventive Measures

Government of India and State Government of Haryana have already banned the ragging of newly admitted students in all the Professional Institutions. The stern disciplinary action is taken against the students indulging in the ragging of the students, including expulsion from the University and hostels/mess or fine with a public apology or withholding of scholarships or other benefit, debarring from representation in events, withholding results, suspension of campus recruitment /industrial training and alike. If, the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, then collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

In view of the involvement of some senior students in ragging of 1<sup>st</sup> year students in some of the Institutions in the previous year, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has directed the concerned Institutions /Universities to take immediate steps for the prevention of ragging of students. The violation of this law (ban on ragging) is not only punishable by a fine of ₹50,000/- but also may attract rigorous imprisonment for 3 years.

In order to curb the ragging, the University takes various steps such as help from the local administration for keeping vigilance in the Campus, senior students are advised individually and in groups and cooperation of their parents is sought explaining the aspects of punishment for violation of law of ban on ragging, by deputing faculty members at different places in the University premises to check the ragging & to book the defaulters during the day and also at mid night.

## What Constitutes Ragging

- a. any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c. asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e. exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- f. any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i. any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.



## Deterrent Measures for Ragging

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/ withdrawing of scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test examination or other evaluation process.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international event.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
7. Rustication for periods ranging from 1 to 4 Semesters.
8. Expulsion from the university and consequent debarring from admission to any other university/institution.
9. Collective punishment where warranted.
10. Lodging of FIR.
11. Display the names and punishment awarded to offender of ragging on the notice boards.
12. Endorse the Migration/Transfer certificates with the remarks and punishment awarded to the person on account of ragging.
13. Imposition of Fine of ₹50,000/-.

# Student Code of Conduct and Discipline

## Student Conduct

Students must follow the rules and regulations of J. C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad such as:

- Carry the identity cards and wear it around the neck at all times especially when inside the university campus.
- Students shall exhibit the highest order of decency not to deface, disfigure, damage or destroy or cause any loss in any manner to public, private or University properties.
- Possessing, consuming or distributing alcohol, smoking, tobacco, harmful drugs, narcotics, e-cigarettes and gutkas are strictly prohibited.
- Drive safely in the university campus and follow traffic rules.
- Park your vehicle in designated parking spots only.
- Do not park in or impede access to crosswalks, fire hydrants or fire lanes.
- Do not allow/entertain visitors in the campus without prior permission.
- Maintain dignity, decorum and decency regarding wearing of dresses, gossiping and behaviors. Respect teaching / non-teaching members as well as fellow students.
- Observe silence and tranquility while walking down the corridors (especially when classes are going on).
- Immediately report any accidents or unsafe behaviors to University authority.
- Students are strictly prohibited from indulging and showing boisterous, disorderly and obnoxious behaviour; staging Dharna, procession, slogan shouting, putting up posters or writing on walls, etc.
- Clustering in the corridors or crowding in front of the offices or the campus roads are to be avoided.
- Refrain from using mobile phones in classrooms, computer centres and other academic areas.
- Students should refrain from environmental damage activities such as throwing plastics, food items etc.
- Students are prohibited from indulging in anti-institutional, anti-national, anti-social, communal, immoral or political activities inside the campus.
- Students shall not interact with media or invite media representatives without prior permission.
- No student shall audio/video record lectures or activities of others without permission.
- Students shall not share audio/video clippings to media without permission.
- Students must use social media responsibly and avoid derogatory posts affecting reputation of individuals or the University.
- Theft or abuse of University computers, electronic devices, networks, systems or private residences is a punishable offense.
- Unauthorized entry of outsiders in the campus or hostels is strictly prohibited.
- Verbal or non-verbal indecent conduct such as remarks, stares, gestures, sounds, messages, stalking etc. will be treated as misbehavior.
- No Society/Association/Club shall be formed without permission of the Vice-Chancellor /DSW.
- Do not convene meetings or invite persons to address gatherings without permission.



## Violation of Discipline of the University

- Disruption of teaching, examinations, research, administrative work or residential life.
- Furnishing false certificates or information.
- Damaging or defacing University properties or vehicles.
- Use of abusive slogans, intimidatory language, incitement of hatred or violence.
- Arousing caste/regional feelings or creating disharmony.
- Engaging in gambling or e-gambling.
- Unauthorized entry or unauthorized occupation of University premises.
- Indulging in Ragging.
- Assault, intimidation or insulting behaviour towards anyone.
- Eve teasing or inappropriate behaviour towards women/girls.
- Possession or use of weapons, explosives or firearms.
- Committing forgery, misuse of documents or ID cards.
- Indulging in Smoking.
- Use of Alcohol and drugs.

## Act of Violation of Discipline

1. All acts of violence and forms of coercion such as gheraos, sit-ins or actions leading to violence.
2. Gheraos, siege or demonstrations around residences of University members.
3. Consuming or possessing dangerous drugs, intoxicants or drinks within the campus.
4. Theft, damaging or defacing property of University or members.
5. Hunger strikes, Dharnas, blocking entrances or disrupting movement.
6. Furnishing false certificates or information.
7. Forgery, tampering with ID cards or University records.
8. Any act of moral turpitude.
9. Use of abusive or intimidatory language.
10. Unauthorized entry or occupation of University premises.
11. Unauthorized hostel occupation or misuse of furniture.
12. Gambling in any form.
13. Blocking movement of persons or traffic; violation of safety rules.
14. Not disclosing identity when asked by authorized personnel.
15. Improper behaviour during tours/excursions.
16. Attempting wrongful confinement of any University member.
17. Intimidation or insulting behaviour.
18. Entering premises without valid sticker/pass.
19. Not wearing ID card in campus.
20. Any other issue not covered above.

## Procedure of Proctorial Enquiry

The University has a Proctorial system where student-related matters of indiscipline are handled by the Proctor with support from Deputy and Assistant Proctors.



## Receiving and Recording the Complaint

- A. Complaint/report received in the Office of Proctor from Registrar Office.
- B. Complaints received directly from students, teachers or staff.

After scrutiny, the Proctor sets up a Proctorial Enquiry Committee of 1–3 members. The enquiry is internal and only committee members are allowed. No representation or observers are permitted.

The Research and Development (R&D) Cell plays a vital role in promoting innovation, creativity, and scholarly engagement among students and researchers. It provides a structured platform to undertake research aligned with academic interests and fosters partnerships with industry through Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs).

The University offers Ph.D. programmes under the R&D Cell in various disciplines. As per UGC guidelines, candidates with a 4-year Bachelor's degree with Research and a CGPA of 7.5/10 (from Session 2024–25) are eligible to apply through the University entrance test. Applicants with valid GATE/UGC/NET/CSIR (JRF)/SLET or regular M.Phil credentials are exempted.

# Central Library

The Central Library of **J. C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad** has been named after the great Indian thinker and leader **Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay**. The Library serves as a knowledge hub of the University and is designed to fulfil the academic and research needs of students, research scholars, faculty members and staff across various departments.

The Library is with an area of more than **7200 sq. ft.** and is fully air-conditioned. It is equipped with modern technological facilities including:

- e-Library Portal with Remote Access Facility
- Institutional Repository
- Federated Search System
- Artificial Intelligence-based Search Tools
- Mobile App (Android and iOS)

The Library is fully automated through the Web-Based Library Management System “**KOHA**”. Web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) enables users to check availability and location of books. The Library is equipped with RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) technology along with RFID-enabled security gates. A 24×7 Book Drop facility allows round-the-clock return of books.

The Library maintains a rich collection of academic resources in Engineering, Technology, Sciences, Management and Humanities. It subscribes to reputed international publishers including **Elsevier (Science Direct), Taylor & Francis, IEEE, Springer Link and Nature** to promote research excellence. The Central Library houses a rich collection of more than 93,000 books in various disciplines including Engineering, Technology, Sciences, Management and Humanities. The digital collection comprises over 8,000 e-book titles, 13,000+ e-journals, and more than 4,000 e-magazines. In addition, the Library subscribes print magazines and print newspapers. Through the Press Reader facility, users have access to approximately 3,000 national and international newspapers, including archived issues. The Library provides access to more than 6 Lakh e-resources through its e-Library Portal with remote access facility. Registered users can access e-journals, e-books, expert lectures, video tutorials, e-newspapers, e-magazines and other digital content 24×7 from anywhere. The Library is a member of **DELNET** and the **e-Shodh Sindhu Consortium**, further strengthening access to national and international scholarly resources.

With advanced infrastructure, extensive digital resources and modern automation systems, the Central Library plays a vital role in supporting teaching, learning and research activities of the University.



# J. C. Bose Technology Business Incubator

In its commitment to nurturing innovation and supporting young entrepreneurs in realizing their start-up aspirations, **J. C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad** has established the **J. C. Bose Technology Business Incubator (JCB-TBI)**. The Incubator has been set up with the support of the **Department of Information Technology, Electronics & Communication, Haryana (DITECH)** and a distinguished alumnus, **Mr. Mohit Vohra**, Founder and Managing Director, MV Electro systems Pvt. Ltd.

The University has developed a vibrant innovation ecosystem centered around JCB-TBI. This ecosystem is strengthened by dedicated facilities such as an IoT Laboratory, Co-working Space, and 3D Printing and Prototyping Setup, enabling students and innovators to conceptualize, design, test, and refine their ideas. The ecosystem promotes knowledge creation, skill development, and technology transfer. At JCB-TBI, aspiring entrepreneurs receive comprehensive support in the areas of technical guidance, strategic planning, business development, and mentorship. The Incubator is guided by experienced faculty members, industry experts, and professional mentors who provide structured assistance from ideation to commercialization. Several promising start-ups have emerged and grown under this mentorship, including The Tee Point, Galichaa, Extreme Insurance Surveyors, KimTech Innovations Pvt. Ltd., METASAGA Pvt. Ltd., Smart Skill Wave, Nestays, Nano Agro, Skillwhiskill, TilaHeal, and SpuruFit.

To foster an entrepreneurial mindset, JCB-TBI regularly organizes seminars, start-up events, motivational and technical lectures, workshops, competitions, and symposiums on themes such as Ideation, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), and Industry–Academia Collaboration. The Incubator also provides assistance in fund mobilization through various governmental and institutional schemes. The University has instituted a comprehensive Start-up and Entrepreneurship Workshop Programme aimed at equipping students with essential business competencies, including market research, business planning, financial modelling, investor pitching, and execution strategies. The Incubation Centre has successfully conducted more than **50 programmes, competitions, and workshops** on innovation and entrepreneurship, along with multiple specialized workshops on Intellectual Property Rights and related domains.

The name *CULMYCA* is derived from the words *Cultural* and *YMCA*. The term *CUL* denotes *Cultural*, while *MYCA* is a stylized derivative of *YMCA*, formed by reversing the letters *YM*.

The festival had its humble beginnings in the late 1970s with a limited number of cultural events. Over the years, it has evolved into one of the flagship events of the University, reflecting its rich cultural heritage and academic vibrancy.

With the passage of time, CULMYCA has emerged as a prominent **Inter-College Techno-Cultural Festival** of the Delhi NCR region, attracting more than 3,000 participants from over 50 institutions. The festival now features a wide range of cultural, technical, literary, and creative events.

In recent years, several innovative technological and cultural components have been incorporated, further enhancing the scale and appeal of the festival. The event is now popularly known as **Elements CULMYCA** and is supported by a dedicated Android application and an official website, enabling seamless participation and wider outreach.



## Co-Curricular Activities



Promoting academic excellence is a core objective of the University; however, it constitutes only one dimension of its broader educational mission. # Infrastructure and Facilities

## Auditorium

The University has a state-of-the-art auditorium designed to host international, national, and state-level events such as conferences, workshops, seminars, meetings, placement programmes, and cultural functions. The auditorium was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Shri Manohar Lal, on October 26, 2017. The auditorium is fully air-conditioned, well furnished, and equipped with modern projection and audio systems, along with high-speed internet connectivity. It features traditional theatre-style seating with a seating capacity of over 200 persons, a raised stage, advanced lighting systems, and a large screen for multimedia presentations. Shakuntalam—one of the major attractions of the University—is a centrally located multipurpose hall designed as per ultra-modern and eco-friendly specifications. Architecturally appealing and functionally versatile, it is extensively used for both sports and non-sports activities.

The hall provides a spacious and well-equipped environment suitable for cultural festivals, workshops, yoga sessions, exhibitions, poster presentations, and various student-driven activities. The facility also includes a High Volume Low Speed (HVLS) fan system that ensures effective ventilation and comfort.

## Health Centre

The University Health Centre is conveniently located within the campus, in close proximity to the academic and hostel blocks. The Health Centre is staffed with one regular doctor, one part-time doctor, a nurse, a pharmacist, a clerk-cum-typist, a dispensary attendant, and supporting staff. It caters to the healthcare needs of students and staff by providing routine medical check-ups, first aid, and treatment for common ailments. The Centre also offers diagnostic services, including CBC, MP (Card Method), Typhi Dot, LFT, KFT, Lipid Profile, Blood Grouping, Widal Test, and ECG.

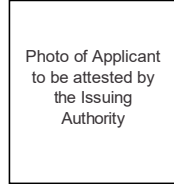

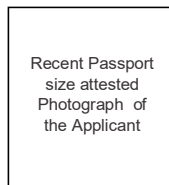

**Subject: Regarding issuing Income Certificates through SARAL portal.**

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your attention to provisions of the *Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021 (20 of 2021)* which provides for the assignment of the Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a unique identifier number to each family. The database namely Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) contains PPN alongwith corresponding information generally required for determining eligibility for, or the provision of any scheme, service, subsidy or benefit provided/implemented by or on behalf of the State Government/any Government agency/local authority. State Government has been empowered under Section 8 of the Act to prescribe Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a requirement for the purpose of determining above mentioned eligibility or provision. The verified information linked with PPN available in Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) has now made it feasible to issue Income Certificates across the counter through SARAL portal.

3. Keeping in view the above, Government has decided to issue instructions regarding issuance of Income Certificates, in suppression of previous instructions, if any, as under:-

**(i) Portal for issuance of Income Certificate.—**

Income Certificate shall be issued to eligible residents of Haryana on provision of PPN through the SARAL portal (<https://saralharyana.gov.in/>) facsimile signed by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner cum District Citizen Resources Information Officer).

These certificates will be issued on the basis of verified data on income contained in FIDR.

**(ii) Person who is entitled to obtain Income Certificate.—**

A person who is a resident of State of Haryana shall be entitled to obtain Income Certificate on provision of PPN and having income verified in FIDR.

**(iii) Verification of Income.—**

The income shall be verified on the basis of the verified data contained in the Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) in accordance with the provisions of the Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021 and notifications issued thereunder.

- (iv) **Competent Authorities for issuance of Income Certificate.—**  
Income certificates shall be issued on provision of PPN through SARAL portal (<https://saralharyana.gov.in/>) to eligible residents of Haryana by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner -cum- District Citizen Resources Information Officer) under his jurisdiction through his facsimile signature on the certificate.
- (v) **Online Service for verification of income based on PPN.—**  
Residents seeking to get their income verified in FIDR may visit '<https://meraparivar.haryana.gov.in/ReportGrievance>' portal. Once the request for verification of income is made by the resident on this portal, designated LC will verify and mark the same as verified in the FIDR for the resident.
- (vi) **Validity of an Income Certificate.—**
- (i) An Income Certificate once issued (in its standard format) shall be valid for the current financial year, i.e till coming 31<sup>st</sup> March (included) from the date of issuance of the certificate.
  - (ii) An Income Certificate may become invalid at any time during the financial year, if after due process, it has been concluded that the income was incorrectly mentioned on the certificate or wrongly verified in the FIDR, due to any reason whatsoever.
- (vii) **Grievance Redressal and Correction Process.—**  
If an applicant is not in agreement with his income contained in the FIDR, then he/she may lodge his/her grievance for re-verification on the Grievance Module of the PPN portal (<https://meraparivar.haryana.gov.in/ReportGrievance>). The grievances will be dealt with as per the mechanism separately notified by Haryana Parivar Pehchan Authority under the provisions of the Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021.
- (viii) **General Terms and Conditions.—**
- (a) The Income Certificate is usable without any restriction wherever it is accepted (i.e., subject to the criteria laid down by the entity accepting the certificate) and hence no usage/applicability restrictions shall be mentioned on the certificate.
  - (b) From the effective date of this order, only the Income Certificates issued through SARAL portal in the format prescribed by the Citizen Resources Information Department, based on PPN and corresponding verified data contained in the FIDR shall be valid Income Certificates.
  - (c) An Income Certificate obtained by means of any fraud, misrepresentation or concealment of facts or by any other illegal means shall be declared as invalid and the benefit availed by the candidate/applicant shall be withdrawn and legal action including criminal proceedings will be initiated against the applicant for misrepresenting the facts and playing fraud, as well as against the officials/authorized persons for incorrect/ wrong verification by collusion or otherwise. In such an event, the income shall

be marked as NOT VERIFIED in the FIDR.

- (d) Mere issuance of an Income Certificate does not entitle a person holding such certificate to any benefit that may be admissible under various Government schemes implemented from time to time. Hence, it is important that the authority concerned examines the applicant's entitlement to any specific benefit in accordance with the instructions on the subject at any given point of time. Other eligibility criteria for a particular scheme shall be addressed separately by the authority extending such benefit.
- (e) All Haryana Government organisations (including Departments, Educational Institutions, Boards, Corporations and Societies) are required to accept the Income Certificate in its standard format prescribed by the Citizen Resources Information Department from time to time.
- (f) Any Government organisation accepting physical copy of the income Certificate for the purpose of any scheme, benefit etc. may check the real-time status of the verified income of the person to whom the certificate pertains, on the PPP portal.
4. No Government Department of Haryana shall obligate any resident of the State to submit income related proof documents if he/she provides PPN and his/her income is marked as verified in Family Information Data Repository (FIDR).
5. The above instructions/guidelines may kindly be brought to the notice of all the concerned for strict compliance.

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Government Notification bearing No. Leg.15/2020, dated 15.05.2020 vide which an Act namely, the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institution) Act, 2020 was enacted by the State Government. In this Act under Section 3 and 6 following provisions have been made:-

*Section 3. (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.*

*(2) Fifty per cent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Caste as enumerated in the Annexure.*

*Section 6. A person belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.*

2. In this Act, 36 Castes were included in the list of Deprived Scheduled Castes at Annexure to this Act. For proper implementation of this Act, all the authorities competent to issue Caste Certificate are directed to mention clearly that the Certificate is of 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' or 'Scheduled Caste' so that at the time of admission the Institutions



may find out easily as to how many candidates applied for admission and how many have been given admission under 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' category.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Government instructions issued vide No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 and thereafter regarding rate(s) of reservation in Govt. jobs and to say that in compliance of the judgement dated 01.08.2024 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case titled "State of Punjab v/s Davinder Singh (CA No. 2317 of 2011) with regard to sub-classification and adequacy of representation, the matter was referred to the Haryana State Commission for Scheduled Castes for examination and to send their recommendations to address intra-community disparities and to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of reservation benefits. The Commission submitted their report on 16<sup>th</sup> August, 2024 prepared on the basis of analysis of the data received from various sources including different Departments and of the demands, representations and review of literature related to the subject. The recommendations of the Commission regarding classification of Scheduled Castes reservation in Govt. jobs were considered by the State Government. After the approval of Council of Ministers, it has been decided that—

- (i) For the purpose of reservation in services, the Scheduled Castes in Haryana will be sub-categorized in two categories i.e. Deprived Scheduled Castes (DSC) and Other Scheduled Castes (OSC).
- (ii) List of Deprived Scheduled Castes and Other Scheduled Castes has been enclosed at **Annexure-A** of these instructions.
- (iii) Within the existing 20% quota reserved for Scheduled Castes in direct recruitment to Govt. jobs, one-half of the posts will be reserved for candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes. If and only if suitable candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes are not available, then suitable candidates of Other Scheduled Castes may be recruited against the balance vacant posts.
- (iv) Similarly, one-half of the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes shall be reserved for candidates belonging to Other Scheduled Castes. If and only if suitable candidates of Other Scheduled Castes are not available, then suitable candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes may be recruited against the balance vacant posts.
- (v) The combined merit list of the candidates belonging to Deprived Scheduled Castes and Other Scheduled Castes selected/recommended by the Recruiting Agency will

be prepared and inter-se seniority of such candidates will also be fixed on the basis of merit.

- (vi) It will not be necessary to fix the roster points separately for each of the sub-categories within the present roster system.
  - (vii) If on a particular occasion the total number of vacant posts (cadre wise) meant for Scheduled Castes is odd, say 9, then 5 of them will go to Deprived Scheduled Castes and 4 posts to Other Scheduled Castes. On the next such occasion, however, the position would be reversed, i.e. 4 of them will go to Deprived Scheduled Castes and 5 posts to Other Scheduled Castes.
  - (viii) After the issue of these instructions, the first vacant post reserved for Scheduled Castes will be allocated to Deprived Scheduled Castes without any change in the roster point already maintained by the Department.
2. These instructions will be applicable with immediate effect and Annexure-B of instructions bearing No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 in which the list of castes which are to be treated as Scheduled Castes in Haryana State has been specified for the purpose of reservation in jobs under Government/Government Undertakings and Local Bodies as well as for admission in Government/Government aided educational/technical professional institutions, will be deemed to have been replaced with the Annexure-A of these instructions.
3. These instructions may please be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.

The aim of this Policy is to provide support by the University to pursue Higher Education including Technical Education, Skill Development to the Abandoned, Surrendered and Orphan Children.

#### Definitions under the Policy:

1. **Abandoned:** Abandoned under this Policy means a child found abandoned whose parents, guardians, relatives could not be traced despite making due inquiry and admitted to the Child Care Institution before the age of 5 years and declared abandoned by the Child Welfare Committee (as per Juvenile Justice Act, 2000/2015) or as per the rules prevailing at the time and has completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institutions.
2. **Surrendered Child:** Surrendered child under this policy means a child who is relinquished by the parents or guardian, on account of physical, emotional and social factors beyond their control and admitted to the Child care Institution before the age of 01 years and declared as surrendered by the Child Welfare Committee after due inquiry (as per Juvenile Justice Act, 2000/2015) or as per the rules prevailing at that time and has completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institutions.
3. **Orphan Child:** Orphan child under this policy means a child, who have lost their parents (both father & mother) and is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian or whose legal guardian is not willing to take or capable of taking care of the child (as per section 2 (42) of JJ Act, 2015) and having the family income (including guardian, if any) less than Rs.2.00 Lakh Per Annum from all sources.

#### Eligibility & Benefits under the Policy

1. One seat in all UG/PG/ other programme of UTD of this University will be reserve for Abandoned / Surrender / Orphan Children.
2. The programmes which required AICTE Approval, the seat will be filled under EWS Category and if same is lying vacant or no application has been received, then seat will be merged in EWS Category. For other programmes except AICTE approved, one seat reserved as supernumerary seat and if remain vacant will not be filled / merged in any other category, as per the provisions of HSTES.
3. The student covered under this policy will be provided 100% free education (all fees including hostel charges) after verifying all the document as per the guidelines of policy. The applicants, who have applied for admission under these categories, may bear application form charges, which will be reimbursable after verification.
4. Criteria for admissions under this policy: -
  - a. Abandoned and Surrendered Children upto to the age of 25 years who were admitted to the Child Care Institutions before the age of 05 year (as Abandoned) and before the age of 01 year (as Surrendered) and have completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institution
  - b. Orphan Children, who have lost their parents (both father & mother) and is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian or whose legal guardian is not willing to take or capable of taking care of the child and having the family income (including guardian, if any) less than Rs.2.00 Lakh Per Annum from all sources.

Both (a) and (b) will be provided Free Higher Education including Technical Education alongwith hostel facilities in the University. However, minimum eligibility criteria of respective courses as per University Information Brochure notified time to time, must be fulfilled by the applicants.

5. The applicant must produce a certificate issued by the Competent Authority/ Body i.e. Concerned District Programme Officer.
6. The admissions shall be made under this policy purely on merit basis.
7. This policy is only for Haryana Residents applicants.
8. The expenditure incurred for admission and continuance of study of such students including hostel expenditure in the University will be met from the Dean Student Welfare fund or some outside NGO/Agencies.

*Copy of letter No. 62/17/95-6 GSI Dated, Chandigarh, the 3<sup>rd</sup> October, 1996 received from the Chief Secretary to Government Haryana addressed to All Heads of Departments, Commissioners Ambala, Rohtak, Gurgaon and Hisar Divisions, All Deputy Commissioners and all Sub Divisional Officers (Civil) in Haryana, The Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court and all District and Session Judges in Haryana.*

**Subject: "Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding".**

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate: -

- (i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
  - (ii) Children/Wards (if parents are not living) / Dependents: -
    - (a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
    - (b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
    - (c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
  - (iii) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
  - (iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
  - (v) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
  - (vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
  - (vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
    - (a) Citizen of India;
    - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/ Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/ Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
  3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.

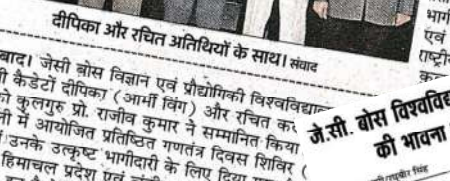

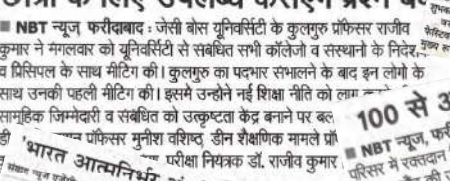
