Real-world case studies, corporate initiatives, and interactive discussions encouraged students to promote inclusivity and stand against discrimination in their future careers.

**On Organizations:** Decreased Productivity, Legal and Financial Repercussions, Lack of Diversity.

Addressing this issue is not just a legal or moral obligation but a business imperative that contributes to the overall success and productivity of the organization.
