Criteria for Best Technical Club:

1. Technical project and innovation (30 Points)

This category assesses the core function of the club – creating and implementing technical projects.

- Projects completed (10 Points): Award points based on the number and quality of projects.
 - 3 or more projects : 10 Points
 - 2 projects : 7 Points
 - 1 project : 4 Points
- Innovation and complexity (10 Points): Evaluate the originality, technical difficulty, and problem-solving aspects of the projects. A panel of faculty experts can judge this.
 - Demonstrated innovation: 10 Points
 - Moderate innovation: 6 Points
 - Standards projects: 3 Points
- Functionality and impact (10 Points): Assess how well the projects work and their potential or actual impact on the community, the university, or a broader audience.
 - High impact/Fully functional : 10 Points
 - Moderate impact/ Mostly functional : 6 Points
 - Low impact/partially functional: 3 Points
 - No impact: 0 point

2. Event, Workshops and Community engagement (25 Points)

This section measures the club's contribution to the University community through educational and collaborative activities.

- Number of Events (10 Points): Points for organizing a variety of events, such as Workshops, Hackathons, Seminars and Technical Talks.
 - More than 10 Events : 10 Points
 - 5-10 Events : 7 Points
 - 1-4 Events : 4 points
- Event Feedback and Attendance (10 Points): Use a combination of quantitative and qualitative data to assess success.
 - Excellent Feedback (e.g. Net Promoter Score) and high attendance : 10 Points

- Good Feedback and attendance : 6 Points
 - Average Feedback and Attendance : 3 Points
- Collaborative Events (5 Points): Award points for collaborating with other clubs, departments or external organizations.
 - Collaborated on 3+ events: 5 Points
 - Collaborated on 1-2 events: 3 Points
 - No collaborations: 0 Points

3. Participation and Recognition (25 Points)

This criterion rewards the club and its members for success in external competitions, recognizing their skill and dedication outside the University.

- Club Performance (10 Points):
 - International Competition:
 - Top 3 finish: 10 Points
 - Participation: 7 Points
 - Inter-University/National Competitions:
 - Top 3 finish: 8 Points
 - Participation: 5 Points
- Member Achievements (15 Points):
 - Individual /Team awards: Points based on prize money and prestige.
 - Tier 1 (National/International): 10 Points
(Example: Google Summer of Code, National Hackathon winners, ICPC Participants)
 - Tier 2 (Regional/Major Inter-University): 7 Points
(Example: Large University-hosted Hackathon or Technical festival winners)
 - Tier 3 (Local/Intra- University): 3 Points
(Example: Winner of College- level competitions)
 - External Recognition: 5 Points for members whose work is published, cited, or earns them internships or placements.
 - Externally Recognized: 5 Points
 - No External Recognition: 0 Points

4. Membership and Administration (10 Points)

This section covers the internal health and management of the club.

- Membership growth and retention (5 Points): Use metrics to track member engagement and long-term commitment.
 - Positive growth with high retention: 5 Points
 - Stable Membership: 3 Points
 - Declining Membership: 1 Point
- Administrative Excellence (5 Points): Punctual submission of required reports, budget management and compliance with university rules.
 - Fully Compliant: 5 Points

- Minor Issues: 3 Points
- Multiple Issues: 1 Point

5. Prize money points system (10 Points)

To directly incorporate cash prizes into the scoring, a system can convert monetary awards into points. A University can define the conversion rate based on its own scale of recognition.

- Prize money points (10 Points): Award prize for prize money won by club members in external competitions. The points scale below is a suggested example, where the total can be capped at 10 Points to balance the other criteria.

Prize Money (INR)	Points
>5,00,000	10
1,00,000 - 5,00,000	8
50,000 - 1,00,000	6
10,000 - 50,000	4
<10,000	2
Nil	0

Summary of Score Calculation

To get the final score out of 100, use the following formula:

Total Score = Score_{Projects} + Score_{Events} + Score_{Recognition} + Score_{Admin} + Score_{Prizes}

A club's total is the sum of its scores from each category, providing a comprehensive assessment of its annual performance.
