

Ramayana is a millennia-old biography of Shri Ram, which finds resonance in the cultures of 100+ countries beyond the considerations of religion and language. This ancient biography of Shri Rama has been translated into more than 300 variants and is still counting. There is a hidden encrypted message in each of the *slokas* of Valmiki Ramayana, and this can enrich humanity in an unprecedented way, if only we were open to it. The course was aimed at providing students with a deeper understanding of the epic Ramayana and its relevance in contemporary society.



Objectives of Conducting VAC on Ramayan:

1. To understand the journey of Rama and its various nuances as narrated by Sage Valmiki in Valmiki Ramayana.
2. To understand various characters of Valmiki Ramayana and the interplay in the story.
3. To evaluate different situations, relationships, characters, incidents of Valmiki Ramayana and observe and understand the eternal message hidden in each of them.
4. To learn the geographical journey that Rama takes from Ayodhya to Lanka and observe it vis-a-vis the current national & international maps of India.
5. To discuss and debate around different nuances around the historicity of Ramayana, dating of Ramayana & science behind various seemingly magical looking incidents of Ramayana.



The course began with providing an introduction to the Ramayana and its significance in Indian culture. Ramayana is not just a religious text, but also a reflection of the social, cultural, and political values of ancient India. A discuss in detail was done on various episodes of the Ramayana, starting from the birth of Lord Rama to his coronation as the king of Ayodhya. The faculty explained the symbolism and allegories present in each episode and how they relate to contemporary society. She also discussed the teachings of Lord Rama and how they can be applied in everyday life.

Each session of the course ended with a question-answer session, where students had the opportunity to ask questions and clarify their doubts



Ramayana embodied different aspects of dharma, and how their actions and decisions can be used as a guide for moral behavior. The course also covered the concept of karma, or the law of cause and effect.

The faculty also explained how the actions of an individual can have consequences in this life and the next, and how the Ramayana teaches the importance of living a virtuous life to ensure a positive outcome. The course also included a discussion on the concept of maya, or illusion, and how it relates to the human experience. She also explained how the Ramayana teaches the importance of overcoming the illusions of the material world and focusing on spiritual growth.

The class was structured in a way that promoted discussion and debate based on self-study and reflection each week. At the end of the program Ramayan Quiz was organized to evaluate the students.
