Subject:- Restructuring curriculum of various courses from the session 2020-21.

There is a wide agreement amongst the academicians and academic administrators that the course content of Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate courses need to be reviewed and restructured more frequently. Pandemic of COVID-19 has necessitated the creation of a New Normal. It is our responsibility as academic leaders of the Colleges and Universities to ensure that the higher education becomes more relevant and meaningful for the New Normal.

May I request you to facilitate the meetings of the Boards of Studies of all the courses with an objective of reviewing and restructuring the course content. Following issues may be considered by the Board of the Studies and Academic Councils:

1. Identification of the topic in terms of:
 - (i) digital self learning
 - (ii) digital aided learning
 - (iii) digital and classroom learning
 - (iv) classroom and lab learning
2. Professional ethics of subject concerned and general values
3. Course curriculum to have focus on livelihood earning methods related to subject concerned.
4. Blending of Indian knowledge system with the existing knowledge systems.

Kindly have more representation from professionals and college teachers as special invitees. If required the Council will be able to identify the subject matter experts.

Blending of Indian knowledge system with existing knowledge (June 2020)

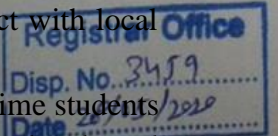
Council plans to put all syllabi of all Universities on single digital platform for the benefit of students and teachers. You may like to fix the deadline for reviewing and restructuring all syllabi by the middle of the July, 2020. Please send the course content as soon as and when approved by Academic Council.

Education is not simply imparting knowledge in a particular faculty or subject or making one fit for securing jobs or passing exams, but at the same time is also a training in logical thinking which helps the coming generations adjust to the ever-changing environment. It also means opening the doors of the mind, cleansing the soul and realization of the self. The quality of education greatly influences the quality of manpower for societal benefits. To achieve this goal in the present scenario blending education is needed between the ancient and present education systems. This will play an important role to improve the basic structure of our education system. A traditional education system needs to be blended with technology.

The present blending learning helps in the growth of the country and boost up the economy of the country. It will help in the skill development of the students. In this pandemic situation learning is done by digital mode. But at the same time this is the time to connect with local communities.

Blending of traditional and digital learning mode is the need of the hour. At this time students can connect local communities with digital mediums. First students have to meet locals and

marginalized sections of society. They need to establish a bond with them and make them understand the power of digital mediums. After establishing connection, communities can share their problems with students on various digital platforms such as smart phones. Further students can raise their voice on various platforms such as Blogs, YouTube, other social media channels & community radio to strengthen them. The outcome of blended learning includes the fact that many students can learn best independently, on their own time frame and connected to society. Students can interact with villagers in their own dialect and develop understanding which may be resulted in developmental reporting. These ways students would be able to do grass root reporting and help in nation building.

Department has made compulsory projects in each semester. Such projects will be mostly on the blending of the Indian knowledge system with existing knowledge.
