#### **15.1 To approve the minutes of 14<sup>th</sup> IQAC meeting held on 02.09.2021**

Meeting of IQAC was held on 02.09.2021. The minutes of the meeting were circulated among all the members through email. No comments/suggestions were received. Minutes are attached as Annexure A.

#### **15.2 To apprise the members about the status of action taken on minutes of 14<sup>th</sup> IQAC meeting held on 02.09.2021**

After the meeting held on 02.09.2021, the action to be taken report was circulated among the concerned officials. The status of Action taken is attached as Annexure B.

#### **15.3 To report about the ISO certification to the University**

The University applied for the ISO certification and went through the process of certification during the months of July and August. The expert team visited the university and assessed as per their norms. The University got the following certifications valid for 3 years. (Annexure-C)

- a. ISO 9001:2015 for Quality Management System
- b. ISO 14001:2015 for Environmental Management System

#### **15.4 To inform about the status of NAAC Cycle 2 accreditation**

The University got its 1<sup>st</sup> cycle NAAC accreditation on 05.11.2016 for 5 years. For 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle accreditation, the Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA) was submitted to NAAC on 20.08.2021. Some clarifications asked by NAAC were answered and the IIQA was approved on 06.10.2021. The University has submitted the Self Study Report (SSR) through online portal within the prescribed time limit on 16.11.2021. As a part of the process, Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) conducted by NAAC is over and DVV Clarifications are still awaited.

#### **15.5 To report classroom feedback of Teachers under 360 degree feedback**

Feedback on Classroom teaching is a part of 360 degree feedback practice of the University, where subject-wise feedback is collected from the students during the mid-semester of university teaching departments and corrective action is taken by the respective chairperson of the department if needed. Department -wise report and action taken report is presented before the house. (Annexure-D)

**15.6 To report about the feedback and action taken on the Facilities and Infrastructure.**

As per the regular practice, of taking feedback from the stakeholders on various university practices/facilities, The Feedback on Facilities and infrastructure was conducted in coordination with Dean informatics and computation. Responses received were collected and analyzed by Mrs. Shruti.

**Subject: New Initiative – Establishment of Horticulture Centre at the University.**

It is submitted that Department of Environmental Science & Engineering in association with Construction & Maintenance Department of University has developed a Horticulture Centre in the university premises. Earlier, only a Greenhouse was developed in 2020, but now the area has been extended into a Horticulture centre.

There are five different points in the centre as follows:

1. **Greenhouse:** A Greenhouse has been developed to provide ideal environment to learn about variety of plant species including herbal, medicinal, succulents and xerophytes. The greenhouse provides a system for plant collection that serves the students, faculty and staff in the university for academic and research purposes. It helps the research scholars, undergraduate and postgraduate students for smooth running of the plant-based experiments. As of now, there are about 100 different plant species in Greenhouse.
2. **Herbal Garden:** University has a rich variety of herbal plants and trees. A herbal Garden containing medicinal plants and herbs of importance have been maintained at Horticulture Centre of the university. The students and staff get benefit from the herbal plants available as and when required.
3. **Composting Unit:** The green waste generated at campus is converted into compost by an in-house built NADEP composting unit. The unit converts the green waste, viz., leaf litter, twigs, weeds, etc. generated throughout the year at the university campus into compost. This compost is utilized for gardening and horticulture purposes within the campus. Use of compost reduces the need for chemical fertilizers. The horticulture team of the university is trained to manage the entire process full time.

4. **Vegetable Garden:** A small vegetable garden has also been developed. Here different vegetables are grown on seasonal basis.
5. **University Nursery:** A small Plant Nursery has also been developed to cater the requirements of residential campus and office area. Different ornamental, flowering and seasonal plant saplings are prepared for placement in campus premises.
